
MEDIA MONITORING REPORT

The consistent trend of news regarding Health Governance topping the relative coverage between our three areas continued on to the first month of the second quarter of 2021. As was the case in the previous months monitored, stories associated with the Covid-19 pandemic dominated Health Governance coverage, with air pollution coming in second. To reflect this, case & mortality stories are reported separately.

News coverage within the themes of Policy and Institutions made up a majority of the total 13 notable Education Governance stories in April. For the first time in 2021, Migration Governance saw more notable stories than Education - a reflection of the pandemic's continued disruptions in both sectors.

Migration

News coverage of stories regarding Migration Governance saw a significant increase in April 2021, rising to claim 33% of the monitored proportion, up from last month's 16%, emphatically overtaking Education Governance to become the second most covered key area. Articles related to institutional efforts in border seals and issues in labor migration were key highlights.
