
MEDIA MONITORING REPORT

This infographic report represents GMC Nepal's attempt to evaluate and understand initiatives taken by the government in each of our three key areas of research: **Health**, **Education**, and **Migration**, through vigilant media monitoring mechanisms. In order to analyze the changing dynamics of the government's attention across various sectors, the media plays a crucial role in reflecting where latest developments and public discourse issues are focused.

Key Area: Health

The month of February saw maximum coverage in Health Governance among our three key areas, with 46% of the total 39 articles revolving around issues pertaining to Health, including stories on the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. Compared to the previous month, there was more coverage on health governance institutions in February.

Key Area: Education



In February, the focus in the sector of education shifted to coverage of new policies, which included the largest share of articles. Given that the Covid-19 pandemic educational disruptions have begun being lifted, much of the coverage outside policy issues highlighted reopenings.

Highlights:

Court grants permission to implement new Curriculum of Grades 11 and 12. (Feb 5th, Ratopati) Cabinet decides to hold Secondary Education Examinations centrally. (Feb 10th, Kathmandu Post)



Key Area:

Migration

Migration, as compared to our other key areas, had a decreased share in coverage in February, with only 21% of our monitored news articles referencing the sector. Although migration related processes are resuming after Covid-19 related disruptions, media attention was more focused on other policy highlights. Two primary policy stories in particular received major media attention, as shown below.
